Keep vigilant following theft of catalytic converte

Officers from the specialist metal theft taskforce are urging people to be increasingly vigilant following a rise in the theft of catalytic converters across the county. The thefts are occurring at all times of the day and night across the county with industrial estates being particularly targeted. Vans



are being targeted predominantly, however all types of vehicles are being affected. Operation Devon, a new dedicated taskforce set up to reinforce Hertfordshire Constabulary's response against metal theft, is investigating these thefts. The team's focus is to target those who steal metal, particularly cross-border criminals who come into Hertfordshire, as well as working more closely with scrap metal dealers to improve processes for accepting scrap metal. The team also works closely with organizations like British Telecom, Virgin Media, EDF, Trading Standards, British Transport Police and other police forces.


Two people sentenced for falsely nominating drivers for speeding offences

Two people have been sentenced for falsely nominating drivers abroad in connection with speeding offences in Hertfordshire. On September 5, 2011, 22 year old Vaneesha Halai from Reynolds Drive in Edgware was driving along Theobald Street in Radlett when she activated a speed camera. After receiving a notice of intended prosecution, she nominated a family member from India as the person driving her car that day. Enquiries by the Hertfordshire Safety Camera Partnership with the UK Border agency found that the aunt had returned to India prior to the offence and therefore could not have been driving.

She appeared before St Albans Magistrates Court on January 27, 2012 and pleaded guilty to perjury and driving at excess speed. She was sentenced to 12 weeks in custody suspended for 12 months, ordered to complete 100 hours of unpaid work and her license was endorsed for the speeding offence.

On April 28, 2010 and August 7, 2011 55 year old Tahsin Berki from High Street, Hoddesdon activated a speed camera on the M25. When he received a notice of intended prosecution he claimed a man from Northern Cyprus was driving. Checks showed the man nominated had not been to the UK in 2010 or 2011.Subsequently, on January 27, 2012 he pleaded guilty at St Albans Magistrates Court to two offences of perjury and one of driving at excess speed. He was sentenced to 26 weeks in prison suspended for 24 months. He was ordered to complete 200 hours of unpaid work over 12 months and his license was endorsed.

Can you help shed light on a persistent story about Hertfordshire Constabulary and the First World War; a story that involves a local brewery and police officers volunteering to fight for their country?

Ex Hertfordshire Constabulary Superintendent and keen Great War historian Terry Cox would like to hear from you.

Terry takes up the story; "During the course of the Great War 85 police officers from Hertfordshire fought in the armed forces – nine of whom were killed. Members of the Hertfordshire Constabulary Great War Society have researched the history of many of these volunteers and one story comes up again and again.

"The Chief Constable in 1914 was Major Alfred Letchworth Annie Law, a strong minded man as befitted those times, and it is said he forbade Constables and Sergeants to volunteer for service during the Great War. Those who went against his wishes were not re-employed upon their return from the front. Allegedly McMullen's, the Hertford brewers, were so affronted by this treatment of returning local heroes they offered a pub to every man who lost his job. A wonderful story but is it really true? "The mystery deepens when you realize that in 1915 Major Law, a Boar War veteran himself, returned to the army and attained the rank of Lieutenant Colonel before returning the Force in 1918. Could such a man really have turned away his former colleagues in arms?" I have been in contact with the McMullen family who can find nothing in the company records but state that their grandfather was an active supporter of the army and the giving of pubs to former police officer exsoldiers sounds like exactly the sort of thing he would have done.

"Can any of you help me prove or disprove this fascinating story?"
