Appeal following an assault in Royston

Police are appealing for witnesses and information following an assault in Royston on December 28. At around 10.50am the victim, a 55 year old local man, was grabbed from behind as he walked his dog along Therfield Heath, just south of the hockey pitch. A second offender demanded the man hand over his mobile phone. The victim's dog then barked at the suspects and they ran off.

The victim was not injured.

The first suspect is described as being in his mid-teens, of a medium build and 5ft tall. He was wearing a black hooded top, blue jeans, white trainers and a multi-colored bobble hat under his hood which he wore up.

The second offender is described as also being in his mid-teens, of a medium build and 5ft tall. He was wearing a black hooded top with the hood up and a hat.

What should I do if I witness a crime?

- If you see a crime being committed report it via 999 or ask someone else to report it if you can't leave the scene.
- If the crime has happened and you do not think the offenders are nearby call 101.
- Don't intervene in a violent incident.

- Pay attention to an offender's height, build, hair colour and length and in particular their clothes. You may be asked to describe them to police.

We will normally ask:

- Your name and address
- The telephone number you are calling from
- A main contact number (mobile or home number)
- The exact location of the incident you are reporting
- The nature of the incident
- Descriptions of the people involved
- Whether you are a witness to the incident or reporting it on behalf of someone else
- For you to stay on the line if you are still watching the incident

You can still report to the police anonymously through CrimeStoppers.

Vehicle Crime

The Police have been saying for years that to leave your valuables in your car in plain view is asking for trouble. We all lead busy lives and when in a hurry we think that leaving items in the car for only a couple of minutes is OK. "I only left my mobile on the dash board for a few seconds" is a common remark the Police Officer will hear after your mobile phone has gone and all that remains is broken glass where your window once was. It only takes a few seconds and it's gone.

Would you leave £100 in notes on the back seat of your car in plain view? No, why? Someone would steal it wouldn't they? We have to get out of the mentality that an object belonging to us is not as valuable as its equivalent in cash. Just because it's small, doesn't mean it isn't worth anything.

We also have to remember that our own sense of morals cannot be transported to others. I personally wouldn't throw a brick through your car window to take your Sat Nav but that doesn't mean that others would not. Leave nothing on show - big or small, night or day, out of sight and take the temptation away.
