Police Foil Theft of JCB Digger



Officers on patrol in Buntingford last night foiled the theft of a JCB digger that was stolen from a building site nearby.

The officers couldn't help but spot the huge yellow digger as it lumbered down Buntingford High Street in convoy with two suspect vehicles just after midnight on August 30.

As they approached the convoy in a police-marked 4 x 4, a number of suspects jumped off the JCB and leapt into the other two vehicles – a silver Mitsubishi Shogun and a white Ford RS Focus.

The Shogun subsequently collided with the police vehicle several times, causing significant damage to the front end. Fortunately, neither of the police officers was injured.

Both cars then made off and the Shogun was found abandoned and blocking the carriageway in nearby Hare Street Road. The digger is believed to have been taken from the Meridian Park construction site.

Catalytic Converter thefts

Residents in North Herts are being urged to be more vigilant following a spate of thefts of Catalytic Converters in the area last month

Offenders are using a device which they place under the vehicles and then cut the catalytic converters off.

The vehicles being targeted are mainly 4x4's and larger commercial vehicle - both allowing easy access underneath to cut off the catalytic convertor.

Sergeant Jon Vine, Safer Neighbourhoods Sergeant for North Herts, said: "There are certain measures people can take to try and prevent themselves from becoming a victim of this type of crime. It is extremely inconvenient to have your catalytic converter stolen, not to mention the expense and potential impact on your insurance costs.

"We would urge motorists to park their vehicles in a garage if they can, or get their catalytic converters property marked – contact your local Safer Neighbourhoods team on 101 for more details.

"We are continuing to increase our patrols in these areas and I would urge anyone who sees any vehicle acting suspiciously, particularly around 4x4s and larger commercial vehicles to call police immediately.

Six Arrested in Covert Metal Theft Operation

Police officers carried out dawn raids at six addresses across North Hertfordshire on Wednesday September 19, making arrests in connection with the stealing and selling of stolen metal. The raids were part of Hertfordshire Constabulary's Operation Precipitate, and were the culmination of a six-month covert investigation into the sale of stolen metal to scrap dealers in Hertfordshire.

Six men were arrested during the early morning raids on suspicion of conspiracy to steal. Those arrested were three from Hitchin aged 30, 37 and 44 years old, a 47 year-old from Royston, a 35 year-old from Letchworth and a 32 year-old from Stevenage.

On line Fraud

A resident of a neighbouring force was recently the victim of a computer scam which left them out of pocket by £140. Whilst using the computer a pop up appeared on the screen purporting to be from the 'Metropolitan Police Specialist Crime Directorate'. It stated the computer had been locked and quoted examples of pornography or copyright infringement as being the cause of the police locking the system. The pop up threatened various fines and jail sentences and that to avoid this the victim should send an email to the given address with a ucash or PayPal voucher for £100 in order to lower the offence. This induced the victim to pay the requested funds with an ucash voucher and they then had to pay £40 to a professional computer company to clean the computer as it remained locked due to a virus contracted during the process.

Please note the Police would never lock your computer and do not communicate with people in this way or ask for money. Do not click on pop ups that appear on your screen unless you are completely sure of their content; you should close or delete them straight away. Ensure that your computer protection against online viruses and threats is up to date.
